**Maple** – Mrs Cool will be on 'Zoom' from 9:30 to 9:45 to introduce your learning and from 1:30 to 1:45 to discuss the learning you have completed so far.

Do not worry if you cannot meet with your teachers at these times, you can still complete the learning activities below. If you have no internet access please ring the office to arrange to pick up a learning pack.

Here are the lessons to help you learn from home. These are the things that will make up your new school day.

Each day could you please do the English and Maths lesson. Then choose one more lesson to do from the Foundation, PSHE or PE and Wellbeing lessons.

These are sequential video lessons made and taught by teachers. The lesson begins with items you need to during the lesson and explains what you will be learning. In the 'Help with your learning' tab you will find a powerpoint with grids to help with your learning.

Below are some activity ideas that you could do on Screen Free Friday, or you can think of your own!

<p>Fri</p>	<p>Start the day by singing your favourite song or listening to your favourite music. <b>Make up some funny lyrics for it!</b></p> <p>If you were in a pop band, what would you be called? <b>Make up a name, design outfits and make a poster for your Band's Tour.</b></p>	<p><b>Stand up for 100 seconds.</b> Ask an adult to time you. Sit down when you think 100 seconds is up. Were you close? Try again to get closer to 100 seconds. How many seconds in a minute? How many minutes in an hour? What time is it now? What time do you get up? Go to bed? Have your dinner? <b>Make a timetable of your activities today,</b> draw clocks and write times next to them.</p>	<p>Prepare some paper and something to draw with, ask an adult to use a scarf or towel to cover your eyes and <b>draw a picture of yourself and your family</b> (blindfolded). Don't forget to draw pets, grandparents, cousin's aunts, uncles etc. Take your blindfold off and ask your family to guess who is who. <b>Then write the names of all of them starting with a capital letter.</b></p>	<p><b>Make the tallest tower possible using your toys</b> (bricks, construction, soft toys etc.)</p> <p>Get a box (a cereal box or any other you can find) and make it into <b>something unexpected</b> (projector, piñata, a mobile for a baby etc.)</p>	<p>Get a mug or a cup and a tea bag. <b>Throw the teabag into the mug from the furthest distance.</b> Keep trying further and further away. Put an obstacle between you and a cup. Make a set of instructions to tell someone how to make a cup of tea.</p>

## Keeping your child safe when they use the internet at home.

The internet is great for learning, sharing, connecting and creating. Set boundaries and agree as a family how long your child can spend online and what they can do. Also decide how access to devices can be shared fairly. Remember there are parental tools that can help you manage and monitor access and use these across all devices. Talk about online safety and get involved. Have conversations about online safety little and often and build it into other conversations. Always supervise your children online. For older children ask questions about what they do online, such as what sites they visit and who they talk to. Know who they are talking to. Tell your child that strangers can pop up anywhere online and remind them not to talk to them. Understand the games they play. Ensure your child knows what to do if someone they don't know contacts them for example - ask you for advice, click the red cross. Check age ratings of games, online movies and websites. Look at the E-SAFETY tab.


